Full-day excursion outside of Bratislava

SNM – Museum Bojnice (castle)

Bojnice Castle is one of the oldest and most important monuments in Slovakia. It stands on a travertine mound above the city. The first written record of the castle dates back to 1113 – the deed of the Zobor Abbey. Bojnice Castle was originally a wooden castle, an upgrade of the former hillfort. Over the course of the 13th century, the castle was rebuilt in stone by the Poznań family.



The inhabitants of the castle certainly knew about the existence of the cave – it probably served as a shelter in times of danger as well as a water reservoir. However, it was rediscovered only in 1888, when the castle well was being cleaned and repaired during the last renovation. The cave was first opened to the public in 1967.

The Bojnice Castle is surrounded by a landscape park. Originally, it was supposed to be a romantic park with various attractions, old romantic ruins, etc. Like any such park, it did not end with a wall, but “flowed” freely into the landscape and between the adjacent houses.

The earliest records of gardeners at the Bojnice Castle date back to 1910. The park is a home to several rare species of trees.

SNM – Museum of Červený Kameň (castle)

The first mention of Red Stone Castle was in the first half of the 13th century. The castle was built at a request of Queen Konstancia Uhorská, the widow of the Czech king, on her own land before 1240. At the same time the castle got the name – Red Stone (Červený Kameň in Slovak, Rothenstein in German, Vorosko in Hungarian) or Beaver Castle.

Červený Kameň Castle specializes in the development of housing culture of the nobility and bourgeoisie in Slovakia.

Museum of Ľudovít Štúr in Modra

Ľudovít Štúr Museum in Modra is part of the Slovak National Museum. It is located in the centre of the town of Modra, in the so-called Emresz's House, which was owned by the family of Karol Štúr's wife and where Ľudovít Štúr spent a great deal of time bringing up his brother's sons after he moved to Modra in 1851. He eventually died in this house on January 12, 1856.

This building houses the main exhibition called Ľudovít Štúr - from studies to actions that gives its visitors an overview of the life and works of Ľudovít Štúr with respect to the historical context. The exhibition includes not only Ľudovít Štúr's precious personal objects, but also those of Jozef Miloslav Hurban and Ján Kalinčiak, alongside with works by Slovak visual artists and respective written documentation.
